Peer Mediators

During October the children had to fill in an application form which was available to do at lunchtimes. Once completed application forms were placed into the application post box.

Questions asked:-

1. Please write why you feel this is a role for you.
2. Why do you want to be a Peer Mediator?
3. Why do you feel you can help in this role?
4. Have you ever had problems at lunchtime?



Children who had replied were informed on Friday lunchtime that they will be told who will be attending the meetings that are held every two weeks. All peer mediators are to attend these meetings ongoing.

The sign to the left is by the benches near the year 4 buildings. If a Peer Mediator is not there, please sit down someone will always come over to you.

There are 11 Peer Mediators 9 of which are in their final stages of training. We have a Lead Peer Mediator who has earned her promotion by helping some KS1 children playing sensible games and has written in her own words what the role means below.

What we do?

Peer Mediators guide children and make sure you have a friend and if you need a buddy we will find you someone. When you or your friend has a little problem we will help to stop this problem. When you feel lonely look out for children with red or blue hats and they can help you too.

What we look like

- Peer Mediators wear a blue hat.
- Training Peer Mediators wear a red and black buddy hat.
- Trained Peer Mediators wear a blue hat with their names on.
- We are people who want to make lunch time better.

How we do it
