Behaviour Systems

- ▶ Rainbow Chart - To reach the rainbow is hard and is about your child going above and beyond the expected.
- ▶ Everyday is a new day and we encourage children to believe this to
- ▶ If your child has had a good day they will get a stamp into the school diary. If they collect enough stamps they will receive a prize at the end of the day.
- ▶ Time outs of either 5 or 10 minutes are used when children make poor choices in the day
- ▶ Teachers will keep you informed of your child's behaviour.
- ▶ Stickers are used for reinforcing good choices

Reading

- ▶ All children have started to learn phase 2 phonic sounds (s,a,t,p)
- ▶ We are introducing them to blending.
- ▶ Once your child can blend they will get a book that they can read to you
- ▶ Non word books are given at the moment for children to tell you what is happening in the story
- ▶ Library books are given so you can encourage the love of reading.


School Handwriting Policy

- ▶ We do not teach uppercase until Spring Term

How can you support your child?

- ▶ Read with them every day
- ▶ Use your child's school diary to send messages to your child's class teacher
- ▶ Talk to your child in a very positive light about school - Really focus on the positives.
- ▶ Encourage your child to eat at home at a table with a knife and fork and to try new tastes.
- ▶ If you need to speak to your child's class teacher about any concerns or worries please do this without your child present. The end of the day is often a better time than the morning but please be prepared to wait until the majority of the children are dismissed.

- ▶ Now you can explore the classroom with your child.
- ▶ Ask the teacher or nursery nurse any questions that you need to.
