Homework and reading

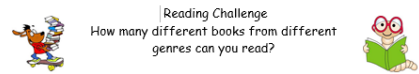
Homework: English, spelling and maths homework will be given out every Thursday and must be returned by Tuesday. If your child is struggling to complete their homework at home, they will be able to join a homework club which will take place during school time. The children will have the opportunity to complete their homework with the support of an adult.

Reading: Each child is expected to read for at least 10minutes every day. If your child has not read and their reading log is not signed daily, then they will attend a reading catch up session in school. 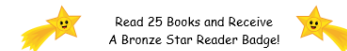

Key messages

School Uniform

Children are expected to wear school uniform at Wood End Park. This consists of:

- Black or dark grey trousers or skirt
- Dark blue sweatshirts or cardigans
- White polo shirt/blouse
- Black shoes

If headscarves are worn for religious reasons, they must be black, grey, white or dark blue.

PE Kits:

- White t-shirt/polo shirt & navy shorts for P.E. navy or black tracksuit bottoms can also be worn.
- Trainers or plimsolls

Please ensure your child has the correct footwear for PE. They will not be allowed to wear their school shoes.

All uniform should be labelled clearly with your child's name and class.

School bags

Children should be using a Wood End Park Academy book bag. Large bags should not be brought into school. Children store their book bags in their trays and the large bags do not fit.
